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# The Stats – Thank you for making an invaluable difference

**£122,000** raised this year. Thank you alumni, parents, carers, staff and students, friends for your gifts to School Fund, Facilities Development, Bursaries, and Joy's Legacy Programme.

# Every gift no matter its size makes an important difference.

- £99,000 raised in School Fund has already enriched every student.
- ✓ **£23,000** raised for Facilities Development.
- ✓ 35 new members of TGS Music Society, 2 keyboards, £1400 for music enrichment.
- ✓ 90% of all giving has a Gift Aid Declaration. £16,000 has been claimed and is included in our giving total.
- ✓ 85% of all giving is planned (monthly, quarterly, annually). Hugely helpful for planning School Fund's budget for 21.22.
- ✓ Gifts have ranged between £2 and £20,000.
- £50, £30, £20, and £10, are all popular instalments.

**Payroll giving** £12,000 is coming via corporate payroll giving schemes. Tax beneficial for the donors and school benefits from much appreciated additional employer matched giving. 


## **Reading for pleasure and academic research**

### **STEM research**



The commitment to STEM at TGS is reflected in the appointment of two staff STEM coordinators for next year, Ms Bisby and Dr Emmanuel.

Ms Bisby reports: We have some new and exciting plans to introduce a STEM project involving all year groups in September. This will include exploring alternative energy sources and other climate related activities to empower students with practical tools and problem-solving skills in a rapidly changing world.

A Molecular Biology Research project led by Dr Emmanuel is already underway

Research question: What are the similarities and differences in DNA harvest and profiles of three members of the genus *Allium*?

Molecular Biology provides the clarification we seek in understanding our world in order to banish misconceptions and ensure progress in understanding many of the phenomena we see all around us. The Covid-19 pandemic, and the hope humanity put in Science to offer some relief to human suffering is a clear evidence of this. Molecular Biology provides the three components of enlightenment: reason, science and progress. Thus, simple research works in Molecular Biology will enable our students to develop basic skills in molecular techniques and fundamental knowledge of genetic applications in life sciences especially, genetics, genomics and bioinformatics which are the bedrock of today's science.

## Fitness and Sport for everyone



**New for Autumn 2021!** Thanks to gifts to School Fund, the School is able to invest in a Fitness Suite, which will be for additional curriculum teaching, and for a much needed club activity for Sixth Form. We are grateful to current and past philanthropy that has enabled the School to upgrade all the sport facilities in school over the past 12 years and most recently in 2018, when the sloping grass playing field was converted to three terraces. TGS sport facilities include 2 grass training terraces and a competition hockey multipurpose floodlight all weather pitch, 2 hard courts, a sprint track, 2 long jump pits and 2 cricket nets. Indoors we have a large sports hall and a studio.

The PE staff is an energetic, experienced and highly committed team. Miss D'Almeida reports:

"It has been great to see students taking part in team sports. We have started lunchtime clubs again, focusing on a "come and play" approach and a choice of activities. It has been brilliant to see so many students from year 7 to the majority of year 12 turning up to play sport.

Summer sports have included our annual "Wimbleton" competition on the all weather pitch, a football competition alongside the European Championships, and a day of sport including an interhouse competition in the sports of rounders, cricket and tennis.

### TGS outreach work in the wider community



Our annual School Fund programme supports aspects of our work in the wider community. Mrs Twinam CAS and Internationalism Coordinator reports on two longstanding relationships West Kent College (now part of North Kent College) and the Scotts Project:


West Kent College is a provision for young adults aged 16-24. This provision is catered for students at entry level learning (basic life skills such as cooking, money, time, healthy lifestyle). The students really enjoy coming to TGS once a week to take part in physical activity. Students who initially find it very difficult to communicate, flourish through playing sport with our students. Year 10 and 11 TGS students are usually involved in these sessions, and this depends on the timetabling for these year groups. Our TGS students are brilliant with the West Kent College students, and it is amazing to witness the students together. This gives our students the experience of working with people with disabilities, communication and the opportunity to learn sign language. As our students become more confident, they begin to lead the sessions. The fitness suite will also make the session more accessible for those students who find it really difficult to take part in sports and games.

The Scotts Project was set up by Gill Scott over 25 years ago due to the lack of facilities offered to young people with learning difficulties. The Trust is a day and residential care provider offering enrichment and life skilllessons. TGS students travel to the Trust each week to provide computer skills, art and media sessions. The collaboration has gone on to provide physical activity sessions.

If ever there was a reason to be grateful for a virtual event, this is it!


It was a terrible disappointment not to be able to meet in person over the last year to congratulate and celebrate the very many achievements of every single student, and the staff for their passion and commitment.
