He only aimed to preserve the well-being and culture of common people. Consequently, Sejong allowed the grievances of individuals to be considered once more, enabling commoners to appeal for what they believe is moral while also maintaining the authority of the judges, satisfying both sides: the public and the ruling class. Throughout his reign, King Sejong countlessly supported the talent and innovations of the lower classes, providing opportunities regardless of their social status. An example of the many times he had done this is in the situation of Chang Yong-sil. Chang's parents raised him while working in the least respected occupations within society. His parents came from the poorer areas of China; they were a part of the Chonin ("Lesser Commoners"), the lowest social status in China in the early 15th century. Irrespective of this, he showed great interest and exhibited remarkable talent for engineering and science, demonstrating outstanding knowledge and his capability to develop technology. Once King Sejong had learned this, he sent Chang abroad to become familiar with the latest technology and new formulae, immediately releasing Chang of the title of Chonin and enabling him to have royal status in society despite his origins. King Sejong acknowledged his people's strength and let them grow, resulting in the invention of several scientific innovations. Chang's situation is one of the many instances where Sejong promoted success through his subjects, encouraging them

to make technological advancements and breakthroughs. By observing King Sejong's selfless acts, individuals can encourage themselves not to underestimate others only due to their background and origins but rather embrace a person's capabilities and potential.

Upon exploring Sejong's reign from multiple perspectives, we can conclude that the lessons offered by him continue to stay pertinent within society, even in modern times. The encouraging qualities and understanding he demonstrates towards each of his subjects inspire individuals today to do the same and follow in his footsteps to become successful leaders.
